

What is the QCE?




Queensland's senior school qualification is:

- internationally recognised
- achievement based
- flexible.



What is the QCE?

- Awarded when students meet the set requirements
- Recognises achievements in Years 11 and 12
- Shows employers and training providers that students have worked consistently and to a high standard
- May be required to enrol in further education and training in Queensland, interstate and overseas

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What can I study?

QCE learning options suit the student's strengths, interests and goals:

- school subjects
- vocational education and training (VET)
- school-based apprenticeships and traineeships (SAT)
- university studies.



School subjects

General subjects - suited to students who are interested in pathways beyond senior secondary schooling that lead primarily to tertiary studies.

Applied subjects - suited to students who are primarily interested in pathways beyond senior secondary schooling that lead to vocational education and training or work.



School subjects

Units 1 & 2

- Formative units
- Provide feedback to students on their progress
- Between 2 and 4 assessments

Units 3 & 4

- Summative units
- Result to be based on
 - 3 Internal Assessments
 - +
 - 1 External Assessment
- Between 25% and 50% externally assessed

Applied subjects do not have external assessment



External Assessment

- Common to all schools
- Same time, same day
- Developed and marked by QCAA
- Conducted in term 4
- Assessing subject matter from units 3 and 4 only



Vocational Education and Training (VET)

- Craigslea SHS is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO)
 - Certificate I Information and Digital Media Technology
 - Certificate I Skills for Work
 - Certificate II Skills for Work and Vocational Pathways
- Partnership agreement with Fit Education RTO
 - Certificate III in Fitness (VETiS funded)
- All units of competency completed = Certificate

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School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SATs)

- SATs allow students in Years 11–12 to enter into a contract of employment with an employer and undertake structured training, on and off the job, while continuing to be enrolled at school.
- Students spend some time at school, some time at work, and some time at training.

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TAFE and SkillsTech

- Students have opportunity to complete VET Qualification via TAFE or SkillsTech.
- One (1) day per week at TAFE/SkillsTech site.
- Students are entitled to complete 1 funded course.



SVETE - School to work transition programs

- VET qualification (funded) and 20 days work experience




What is ATAR?

- Primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions across Australia
- Indicates a student's position relative to other students
- 2,000 point scale from 99.95 down to 0.00
- Will be calculated by QTAC for entry into courses in 2021
- Students must pass an English subject
- Will be the new standard pathway for Year 12 students

Choosing subjects for Years 11 & 12

QCE & ATAR

6 General subjects

or 5 General subjects & Certificate III Fitness

or 5 General subjects & 1 Applied subject

QCE & VET

Combination of General subjects, Applied subjects & VET course



Important

Students should continue to choose subjects

- they enjoy,
- that they are good at, and
- that are prerequisites for the tertiary courses they want to apply for.

Choosing to study 'easy' or 'hard' subjects will not help with scaling or results
