		IA2: Students create a perspective of a contemporary social issue, and then create an open letter that aims to persuade their audience of media readers/viewers of the validity of the perspective. Unit 4: Close Study of Literary texts	Students explore representations of the world and human experience by engaging with literary texts from diverse times and places. Students explore how these texts build a shared understanding of human experience and examine how representations of social, moral and ethical issues position readers. Building on past unit knowledge, students explore further the ways in which language choices shape meaning and influence audiences	IA3: Students create an interpretive monologue representing a character's engagement with a concept from a literary text. Mode: Spoken Text type: Imaginative spoken response Length: 5-8 minutes	Notice of Task: 4 week's notice Task available 9am Monday 21 June Task Due: Term 3 Week 4 Submitted before 10pm Sunday 1 August
		IA4: EXTERNAL ASSESSMENT Students will write an analytical essay in response to <i>Macbeth</i> for an audience with a deep understanding of the text. They will communicate an informed and critical perspective in response to an unseen question.
